# WHAT IS A DAILY APPOINTMENT WITH GOD?

If you received a call tonight from a very important person asking you to meet them for breakfast early tomorrow, I'm sure you'd change your schedule, even get up earlier than normal, to be able to sit down and talk with them.

Every Christian has the opportunity for a personal meeting with the most important Person in the world. The God of the universe invites you to spend time with Him every day.

Many Christians call this daily appointment their **Quiet Time (QT)**. It is just that — a *quiet time*. It is a segment of your day that you set aside to quiet your mind and heart from the distractions of life and focus your attention upon the Lord God.

## FEEL LIKE YOU ARE TOO BUSY TO HAVE A QUIET TIME?

QT's do not have to be long. They don't need to last a particular length of time. As you grow and learn in your Christian life you will find yourself spending more time, but start off with 7-10 minutes. I'll give you some suggestions of what to do shortly.

## WHEN SHOULD YOU HAVE A QT?

Many people take time at the start of their day to read in the Bible and pray. They desire to meet with God before facing the demands of a busy day. Others set aside a period in the afternoon or evening for their Quiet Time. Whether you are a morning person or a night owl, select a time that will work best for you. Your aim is to be consistent.

**Jesus** made it a priority to have a Quiet Time even when He was tired. Though His previous day had been very exhausting, He made sure to get up early and find a solitary place to pray and talk to His Father in heaven. **Mark 1:35** records it, *"Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed."*

In the Old Testament, one of the greatest kings was **David**. In spite of being very busy, he wrote that he would start his day meeting with God in the following two psalms.

**Psalm 5:3** *In the morning, O LORD, you hear my voice; in the morning I lay my requests before you and wait in expectation.*

**Psalm 143:8** *Let the morning bring me word of your unfailing love, for I have put my trust in you. Show me the way I should go, for to you I lift up my soul.*

Some Psalms were written by other people. They also conveyed the same desire of looking forward each day to spending time talking with God and reading His Word.

**Psalm 42:1-2** *As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?*

**Psalm 130:5-6** *I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in his word I put my hope. My soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen wait for the morning, more than watchmen wait for the morning.*

### Time Enough

You will find you have time enough to meet with God if you TAKE TIME away from tv, novels, newspapers, computer, hobbies.

Go to bed a half hour earlier.

## WHY SHOULD YOU HAVE A QT?

Spending a few moments each morning reading the Scripture and praying is not your *duty* or *obligation*. Rather, it is the **privilege** of talking with your best Friend, the One who loved you enough to die for you on the cross. It is your opportunity to find refreshment, encouragement, strength and guidance for your day.

I know you are busy. But don't let other activities crowd out your time alone with God each day. We are told in **Luke 10:38-42** that Jesus visited the home of two sisters, Mary and Martha. Martha was rushing to get food and everything else ready to serve Him. Mary, on the other hand, stopped what she was doing to sit at Jesus' feet and listen to Him. When Martha complained to Jesus that Mary wasn't helping her, He responded by **commending Mary for sitting and listening to Him**. He said, "*Mary has chosen what is better.*" In other words, even though you are busy, Jesus deserves your undivided attention before you rush off to your day.

## WHERE SHOULD YOU HAVE A QT?

The key is finding a *solitary* place, a place where you won't be interrupted. It might be the kitchen table, or a favorite chair. It could be in your parked car at work, before your day begins or at lunch time. You simply want a place without distractions.

## WHAT DO YOU DO DURING A QUIET TIME?

**Begin with prayer:** *"Lord, I'm looking forward to meeting with You today. Thank You so much for loving me. Without Your help today, I will blunder through, so I desperately need to hear from You. Please help me to understand Your Word and open my heart to be willing to obey what You show me."*


Use a simple format of only three steps — observing what the Bible says, personal insights and thoughts, and a prayer. I use stick figures to represent each of these steps. An example is on the following page.

 = **What it says**

The first step is taking time to observe what the Bible actually says. Draw a little box on the left border of your page and then write what the text says. You don't have to rewrite the exact words of the Scripture. Paraphrase or summarize it in your own words. You'll see how I did that in the sample on the next page.

 = **My insights**

Draw this picture of an eye to start the next segment. Now you record your own insights or questions about what the text says. Try to answer the questions, "What difference should this passage have in my life? What principles seem to be embedded in this portion of God's Word?"

 = **My prayer**

Write out a prayer to the Lord. Ask God to help you apply what you've read to your life. Ask for His strength and guidance for your day.

**Close with prayer:** *"Lord, thank You for this time. I want to enjoy You today and bring pleasure to Your heart. So help me to put into practice today what You've shown me. I love You."*

## HERE'S MY SAMPLE QUIET TIME

You will learn this simple method of having your own Quiet Times by using the book of Philippians. Here's some background to help you understand the book. It was written by a Christian missionary named Paul. He is often referred to as the **Apostle Paul**. Before he became a Christian, he was trying to destroy the Christian movement. But after he was saved, he became one of the greatest missionaries the world has ever seen.

Paul traveled extensively, sharing the gospel and starting churches. One such church was founded in the city of Philippi in the northeastern part of Greece. Philippians is the letter he wrote to the Christians in that city about ten years later, around AD 62.

Below is a sample Quiet Time in Philippians 1:1-6 in which I've recorded my observations, insights, and prayer.

### Philippians 1:1-6

1 Paul and Timothy, servants of Christ Jesus, to all the saints in Christ Jesus at Philippi, together with the overseers and deacons: 2 Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

3 I thank my God every time I remember you. 4 In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy 5 because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, 6 being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

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Paul was very grateful for the Christians in the town of Philippi. Their partnership with him in spreading the gospel brought a smile to his face when he'd remember them.

Paul prayed often for them and was confident that the work Jesus had started in them would continue to blossom and mature, right up to the time Jesus returned.



There have been people in my life who have spurred me on in my walk with Christ. By their example of living for the furtherance of the Gospel, they have kept me on track. I need to lift them up in prayer. I also am challenged to send them cards stating how much they have blessed my life.

My growth as a Christian is assured because of Jesus' faithfulness to finish what He started in me. Of course, I have the responsibility to cooperate with the Lord. The best way to keep growing and maturing is to be sharing the gospel regularly and seeking to live a holy life.



Lord, I want to cooperate with You and participate with others today in spreading the gospel. Open my eyes to an opportunity to share You with someone today.

Thank You, Jesus, for loving me today more than I can ever imagine. Thank You also for giving me Your Bible to guide my life. I love You, Lord, and surrender myself to Your will today.

## **LET'S HAVE A QUIET TIME**

Let's practice right now using **Psalm 1:1-3**

1 Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stand in the way of sinners or sit in the seat of mockers.

2 But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night.

3 He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers.
