

Moses, Part 2

Before the Exodus

Exodus 5:1-23 This was Moses' first encounter with Pharaoh. Not only did the king refuse his request, but life became more miserable for the people he was trying to help. What did Moses do?

Exodus 6:1-12 God restates His intention to deliver the Israelites from slavery. But the people did not believe Moses when he told them. When God told Moses to go back to Pharaoh, he seemed to raise the same excuse he used at the burning bush: "I'm not a good speaker." What excuse do you often use to tell God to use someone else to accomplish His mission?

After the Exodus

Exodus 14:10-14 The Hebrews stood at the edge of the Red Sea with Pharaoh's army bearing down on them. Contrast the reaction of the people and that of Moses. Where in your life do you feel "hemmed in" and need to take Moses' advice?

Numbers 12:1-16 About a year after leaving Egypt, Moses had a conflict with his siblings. Why were Aaron and Miriam upset with Moses? How did they handle it? How did God solve the conflict? What do we learn about Moses from this?

In the Wilderness

Numbers 16:1-50 Seems like everyone who is in leadership deals with people who find fault with them. Who rose up against Moses? What were their issues? How did he deal with it? Did this end the protests?

Numbers 20:1-13 For striking the rock instead of speaking to it Moses was not allowed to enter the Promised Land. Why do you think God considered it that big of an issue?
